In Week 1, we gathered as a school community in the Commons for an Easter Liturgy, beautifully led by our Year 6 Student Leaders. By mid-Term 3, we hope to unveil a brand-new sandpit, trampolines, monkey bars, and a climbing frame. Major construction on new facilities is scheduled to begin in the final week of this term.

Naturally, these changes will affect play areas. In response, we are introducing new creative play opportunities in the courtyard, along with organised sports and student-led clubs, particularly as the weather cools. We are confident our amazing students will adapt positively and patiently as our upgraded facilities take shape.
